

Schedule C: Activity Conditions



Activity **Boat Tours / Cruise: Motorised**

- Conditions**
1. In addition to any other Licences, permits and authorisations required by law, all boats carrying passengers must have a current Certificate of Survey from Australian Maritime Safety Authority.
 2. Vessel operators must abide by the berthing limits as indicated on pier.
 3. Vessel operators must observe the Marine Act 2010 at all times.
 4. To avoid translocation or new introductions of marine pest species vessels operating are to be maintained according to Victorian Government boat-cleaning protocols <http://agriculture.vic.gov.au/fisheries/policy-and-planning/marine-pests-and-diseases>.
 5. Vessels must not discharge sewage, oil, garbage, sediment, litter or other wastes in to the water. Waste should be disposed of at pump out facilities at marinas and other suitable sites.
 6. All crew are required to hold the appropriate certificates under Australian Maritime Safety Authority's manning determinations as detailed on the certificate of survey.

Activity **Seal / Dolphin Watching**

- Conditions**
- NON PROTECTED AREAS
1. Do not approach within 30 metres of a seal on land, whether you are also on land or in the water.
 2. Dogs are not permitted within 50 metres of a seal on land.
 3. Do not approach within 5 metres of a seal on a boat ramp, pier or other man-made structure.
 4. Dogs must not enter the water within 150 metres of a dolphin, 300 metres of a whale or 50 metres of a seal.
 5. It is illegal to touch or feed a seal.
- PROTECTED AREAS (a Marine Mammal Permit might be required, please contact DELWP)
1. No boating activity is allowed at Logan's Beach between 1 June and 31 October each year.
 2. No boats are allowed within 200 metres of dolphins in Ticonderoga Bay sanctuary zone (Port Phillip Bay).
 3. Dolphin swim Tours are not permitted in Ticonderoga Bay sanctuary zone.
 4. Boats must not approach within 30 metres of a seal at Seal Rocks, Phillip Island.
 5. During the seal breeding season (1 November to 28 February), boats must not approach within 100 metres of a seal at Lady Julia Percy Island, Cape Bridgewater, Rag Island and the Skerries.
 6. Outside the seal breeding season (1 March – 31 October), boats must not approach within 50 metres of a seal at Lady Julia Percy Island, Cape Bridgewater, Rag Island and the Skerries.
 7. Jet skis must not approach within 300 metres of seal breeding colonies.

Schedule D: Location Conditions



Park / Land Victorian State Waters - Southwest Region

Activity Boat Tours / Cruise: Motorised

Conditions Vessel operators must observe the Marine Safety Act 2010 at all times. Remain a minimum distance of 5 metres from breakwater. At no point is a vessel to stop or reverse its course or disembark on the breakwater unless for legitimate navigation or marine safety purpose. All vessels must travel in an anticlockwise direction along the inside of the breakwater and pass oncoming vessels in accordance with the Marine Safety Act 2010 by altering their course to starboard to pass on the portside of each other. Waste should be disposed of at pump out facilities at marinas and other suitable sites. Interaction with wildlife Vessel operators must adhere to the minimum approach distances and caution zone restrictions under the Wildlife (Marine Mammal) Regulations 2009 Vessel operators must not disturb breeding wildlife and migratory birds Vessels must not impede the passage of wildlife Vessel operators must operate with caution and reduce speed when in the vicinity of wildlife The touching or feeding of any wildlife, including chick, eggs or burrow, is not permitted. Vessel operators must not make loud or sudden noises in the vicinity of wildlife. Vessel operators must not play back or cause to be played back an underwater sound or recording of any kind. Vegetation Vessel operators must avoid anchoring over seagrass areas to protect sensitive seagrass communities. Night photography Spotlights should be no more than 35 watts and are to be red filtered 'floodlight type' as opposed to direct, intense beam (red cellophane over the lens is sufficient). Avoid excessive noise and prolonged exposure to wildlife by the light (i.e. more than 2 minutes) and use spotlights indirectly (i.e. shine the bright spot past the wildlife). Flash photography is not permitted. Video cameras, without lights, can be used. Other Dogs and cats are not permitted onboard vessels.
